

We all have people that we admire, love, and look up to. For some it may be a doctor, a neighbor, a parent; and for many it is a teacher. My choice in the person I admire is Theodor Geisel. Have you ever heard of him? If I said Green Eggs and Ham, The Cat and the Hat, Horton Hears a Who, you would know that Theodor Geisel is none other than Dr. Seuss. He had over 48 books translated into more than 20 languages, and sold more than 200 million copies earning him Caldecott and Pulitzer Awards. Even with what seemed a great life, he faced many struggles, but he ultimately knew he was valuable. One of his teachers told him he could not draw. His publishers told him he could not write. Twentyseven publishers rejected his manuscript. With all this he always knew he was valued by one person, his father who encouraged him to be the creative inventor and writer he was. Vincent Van Gogh said, "If you hear a voice telling you that you cannot paint, by all means paint and that voice will be silenced."which is exactly what Dr. Seuss did!

As educators ourselves we understand the importance of making sure our students are valued, and continue to be shaped and molded into the person they are meant to be. They must never forget that they are valuable to us, the teachers who guide them daily to reach their potential and like Dr. Seuss' father never hesitate to tell them so.

As Gamma Epsilon members and educators ourselves, it is our
